Certified Instructors SEO/DEO Tool

A new tool to locate certified instructors with their certification expiration dates by squadron or district has been added to the SEO/DEO Tools page. The SEO/DEO Tools web page is also accessible from the SEO and DEO home pages. The squadron display lists certified instructors in order of their certification expiration date. The district display is ordered by squadron and expiration date.

America's Boating Course - 3rd Edition Course Tips

These course tips are being provided to help educational officers, course chairs, and instructors in conducting ABC3 courses. The list below is just a start of this help section. It will be expanded as the need arises. Please mark this page for quick reference in the future.

Printing ABC3 Course Completion Wallet Cards

When printing fewer than all 10 of the cards on the wallet card sheet, start at the bottom of the sheet which allows the printing to remain aligned. If you start from the top there is not enough paper to keep the sheet aligned. This system has been used several times with great success.

Use 2012 Edition Material

If it does not say 2012 on the cover or first page of the ABC material, you are probably using out of date material. The NASBLA approved student materials, with the exception of the bonus ABC3 Courseware CD which is a 2010 product, all have 2012 readily apparent. Most recognize that the ABC3 Student Kit material cost set forth in the USPS materials catalog includes answer sheets (ED-26), registration forms (ED-46), completion certificates, wallet cards, float plans, and promotional materials—a good deal for squadrons.

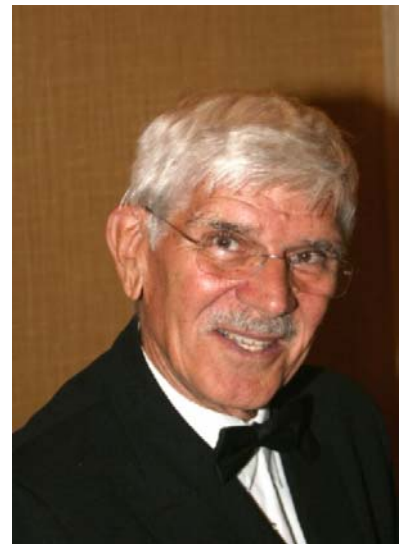
This Student Kit, as well as the Instructor Kit and On-Line course, has been approved by NASBLA to meet NASBLA 2012 standards and most state requirements for required recreational boater education. USPS instructors are obligated to teach using these NASBLA approved materials, all dated 2012, to satisfy educational requirements *before* the Squadron Commander signs the certificate and wallet card signifying satisfactory course completion. The ABC3 Instructor Kit materials are all labeled 2012, including the assessment examinations. The Instructor Kit, which includes all instructor materials and student materials, is a great bargain too, so take advantage of using the "latest and greatest".

ABC3 Bonus Courseware CD

The ABC3 bonus courseware CD aids the student in post-course review and pre-course study. It assists the on-line student when preparing for Federal regulatory and safety questions in the final examination. It is not intended to aid classroom instruction and does not include any required state laws and regulations material. It is up to instructors to add these topics and questions. State questions are available from the protected State-Specific and ABC3 Chapter 5 Exam Questions web page.

Your State Boating Law Administrator and Memorandum of Understanding

The recognized document for a USPS—State education agreement is a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). In accordance with these MOU, electronic dissemination of course schedules when listed in HQ-800 occurs to the respective state, followed by course completions including names and student characteristics when agreed to, and provides collective student numbers at year end. It behooves all SEOs to visit the EdDept home page, pull up the respective state information from the State Boating Information web page, and then review it with your state Boating Law Administrator (BLA). Keep the BLA or his/her designated representative in your sphere of those important to state relationships. This is a critical step to validate that the person and email address listed as the BLA representative to receive USPS data transmissions is correct. The connection from USPS and individual districts and squadrons to their respective state is vital to smooth operations and a positive relationship.



District Executive Officer D/Lt/C Robert Howd, JN

D27 has just completed the fall council/conference. It was in Wrightsville Beach and hosted by Goldsboro Sail & Power Squadron. Everything worked as planned. We thank you Goldsboro. Under the Executive department, co-op charting awards for the year ending March 31 were given out. Twelve squadrons (Albemarle, Cape Fear, Charlotte, Durham, Fort Macon, Goldsboro, Greensboro, Lake Norman, New River, Rocky Mount, Shallotte River, and Tar River) and D27 received honor roll certificates and Shallotte River received the William T. Casey Award trophy for the most improved squadron. V/C Luis Ojeda SN, the National Administrative Officer, was our national representative. We also had R/C Bob Palmer, National Assist Education Officer.



The Public Relations Officer has been getting articles published in three magazines (Carolina Salt, All At Sea Southeast, and Southwinds). These articles have included a list of power squadron courses, the automated radio check article and a Partner in Command article. When you scroll through the magazines, the page numbers are different because the computer counts the cover and other pages not counted in the original magazine. Look at the page number on the page itself.

You will notice that these articles have been about Fort Macon Sail & Power Squadron because it is the JB's home squadron so he had the information. The publications would like information from all squadrons. They cover the entire states of North and South Carolina so any squadron's articles are fair game. The articles need to be submitted to D/Lt "JB" Bagby at least a month in advance of desired publication date. Send to jbagby124@embarqmail.com. JB will be contacting each squadron to get inputs.

The co-op charting program for this year is moving along smartly. Updating the last BITTS article statistics for co-op charting, we now have eight squadrons (Albemarle, Cape Lookout, Charlotte, Fort Macon, Greensboro, Lake Norman, New River, and Rocky Mount) on the honor roll for this year. Six more (Cape Fear, Fayetteville, Goldsboro, Shallotte River, Southport, and Winston Salem) are participating. We are getting closer to the 15 squadrons participating for the district to be on the honor roll. Only one district is on the honor roll. We are currently ranked #3. I have heard from at least one more squadron that they are going to get involved in Nov. There are now 28 individuals representing ten squadrons on the individual honor roll. Nationally there are 124 individuals on the honor roll so D27 has about 1/4th of the total. If you need some help, our point of contact is Phil Benson bensonphil028@gmail.com.

As of Nov 1, a new CCWEB has been installed. It will take a little getting used to but it is workable. I logged in and it does work.

The Aids to Navigation Cruise that Fort Macon Sail & Power Squadron hosted on October 20 was successful. There were about 55 people who took the cruise. 40 were non-members so there is a great membership opportunity. Four members of Raleigh also attended.

VSCs are coming along well too. We have seven squadrons with more than 100 so far (Cape Fear, Cape Lookout, Fort Macon, Lake Norman, New River, Pamlico and Shallotte River). We have about 1800 exams completed in the district. An area we need improvement on is that we should have nearly 180 examiners but we only have 120. The VE exam is available on the website. *Continued next page*

The annual inventory of the red PFDs is due November 15. As of the second week of November we had 15 inventories completed.

Upcoming is the district training session January 5 in Raleigh. This is where each officer is given training on his/her job. Save this date as one of the most valuable days for your bridge officers.

Activity in the Administrative Officer Department has been diverse over the past few months. Squadron AO's have been informed of some reporting requirements and some Squadrons were active with the Boarman Youth Poster Contest.

One report that each Squadron should complete early, as it gives a report card as to progress that the Squadron is making, is the "Doing it Right" report. This was discussed during the Fall Council/Conference and through e-mail communications. As of the writing of this article, three (3) of the 20 Squadrons in D27 have submitted their reports. The first report was sent in by Greensboro, followed by Charlotte and Cape Fear. Cape Fear received acknowledgement from the Rear Commander that **Cape Fear is the first Squadron to indicate that they do all 25 activities listed on the form.** Not on a District 27 level, but nationally. This sets a high standard for the rest of the Squadrons to shoot for. But this is not a competition between Squadrons or Districts. It is a measure of how your Squadron is doing relative to activities that should make the Squadron stronger.

The Squadrons that had entries for the Boarman Youth Poster Contest presented them to D/1st/Lt Paula Schubert, who, with a panel of eminently qualified judges, selected the top three winners in each age category. Twenty-eight posters were submitted for consideration at the District level. The top three winning posters in each category were displayed at the banquet on Saturday night during the fall Council/Conference. Each of the top three winners received certificates and ribbons. The First Place posters will be submitted to the National Contest which will be judged at the USPS Annual Meeting to be held in Jacksonville, Florida in January. 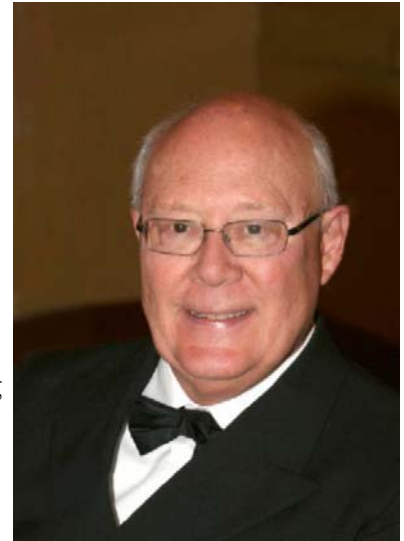
All of the participants who submitted posters but did not place will receive a Certificate of Participation for their efforts from the District Commander.

District Secretary

When I first became the D27 secretary, I did so with the idea of simply keeping things moving along. Phrases such “maintain the status quo” and “go with the flow” and “business as usual” best exemplify my thinking at that time. And then things started to happen. The first thing I encountered was that the D27 website was in really bad shape. It became very clear to me very quickly that there was lots of room for improvement in several directions. The D27 Secretary’s Department covers a lot of territory; much more than I realized. I quickly found that I had a lot to learn and that there were many areas to be considered.



I am sure the vast majorities of us have heard and remember the great song by the Beatles “I Get By with a Little Help From my Friends”. Admitting that we remember that song may date us a bit, but that is OK. In the case of the D27 website, I did exactly that. I contacted Luis Lopez, fellow RSPS member and RSPS webmaster and all-around web wizard. When faced with that challenge, Luis went at it with a vengeance. Luis now wears the badges of both RSPS Webmaster and D27 Webmaster. So we now have a very much improved D27 website. We have also moved to a commercial Internet Service Provider (ISP) which gives us more storage space than we ever imagined possible. It will be a long time before we even come close to using all of it. The next step in the evolution of the D27 website is the addition of photographs. The new tab is labeled “PICTURES”. We may change it in the future, but that is what it is today. The photos will be organized by the D27 event being posted. So far we have photos from the March 2012 Change-of-Watch (JB Bagby – Fort Macon, photographer) and the May 2012 Rendezvous (Frank Schubert – Durham, photographer). We will add photos from the fall 2012 Council/Conference soon. We would also like to add previous events such as the 2011 COW at Carolina Beach and the 2011 Rendezvous at North Myrtle Beach.

The move to the commercial ISP gave us another opportunity which I have described before. We now have group e-mail lists which make life easier for all of us. We have generic e-mail addresses such as squadroncommanders@uspsd27.org and secretary@uspsd27.org and bridge@uspsd27.org. Now we are adding pastdistrictcommanders@uspsd27.org. However this is not fully operation yet. As just one step in the security provided by our ISP, each recipient of such a group address must accept the “invitation” from the ISP to be part of the list. Until that is completed, the list is not fully functional. As soon as it is, we will advise everyone in D27 that it is working. The Assistant D27 Webmaster, Stefan Ufer, is the key person responsible for this.

We have one other improvement already planned for the D27 website. We plan to implement a new tab entitled DOCUMENTS. This is to contain information useful to everyone in D27. It is to be a repository for documents which do not constantly change. We considered other terms such as REFERENCES and FORMS, but mismatches quickly became apparent. So DOCUMENTS it is. This would include such things as D27 Bylaws, D27 Standing Rules and the Squadron Commander’s Report form. Please do not go looking for it because it is not there yet; I just wanted everyone to know that we are hard at work and just sitting around resting on our laurels. BTW – If anyone finds a laurel laying around somewhere; I would like to know about.

Now we can talk about the infamous D27 Squadron Commander’s Report. BTW – This is a D27 form and NOT a USPS form. As a group, we are getting better!!!! The target/goal/hope is to have those reports to the D27 Secretary 2 weeks prior to the meeting for which they are destined. The good news is that the reports had all been received prior to the Fall Council/Conference. *Continued on next page*

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This makes it 2 meetings in a row where we have had all of the reports received before the meeting starts. This is a definite improvement. At the 2-weeks-before target, 1/3 of the reports had been received. At the point of one week before the meeting, 75% of the reports had been received. The last report was received the day before the meeting. My thanks to the squadron commanders who are all clearly working to improve their response time. From our side, we are continuing to work on improving the Form itself. I would appreciate hearing from any squadron commander who has a problem with the Form with the details of what they experienced and what they want us to fix.

The time has come for the winter 2013 edition of the annual D27 get-smart get-together known as the New Squadron Officers education. This occurs on 5 Jan 2013 at the NC State University Club. It is not by accident that this one-day event occurs just at the start of the Change-of-Watch season, nor is it an accident that the meeting occurs in the middle of North Carolina. In the 8 weeks following this meeting, almost every squadron in D27 has its Change-of-Watch. This is the best opportunity for every in-coming officer (or potential officer) to learn the nuts-and-bolts of the job into which they are about to be launched. And I can assure you that each and every D27 Bridge member will be there and more than happy to answer any question you may want to raise. This event has grown every year since we started it because D27 members are realizing how valuable it is. It is carefully constructed so that attendees can drive to Raleigh and attend the training and still return home in just one day.

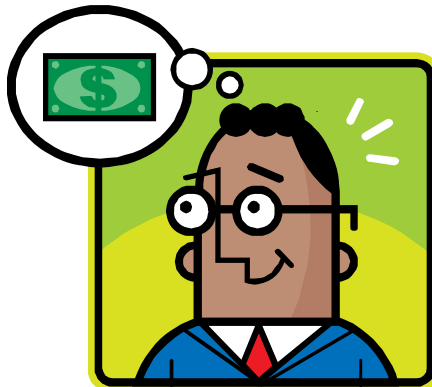


The District continues to do well as it relates to expenditures vs income. I am still waiting on the State to process the Sales Tax rebate for January to June. If your squadron has participated with the District in requesting a refund, I will be getting your refund to you just as soon as I get the State check. I appreciate the 8 squadrons that chose to participate and in turn provide additional support to the District.

This year has gone by very quickly and we are only a few months away from beginning our Change of Watch's. I cannot tell emphasize enough how critical it is to have your new Bridge members attend the District Training scheduled in January. All squadrons should have the names of those who will be taking on the responsibilities of the Bridge, even if they have not been installed, and they should attend this important training session. Having an opportunity to hear from those who have served in the various positions can make your term a lot easier and enjoyable. As it relates to the Treasurer's, what you do or not do can have a very serious impact on the non-profit status of your squadron. We will provide you with all the information you need to make sure that does not occur.

I understand that National, during the Conference in Detroit, has approved a \$2 increase in dues, I am currently working on a proposal for the Budget Committee to consider and at this time I do not see the need for the District to have an increase. What I do see is the need to be more cautious with our subsidizing of the various activities of the District, i.e. Rendezvous, Conferences, or there will definitely be a need for an increase in the future. To offset the need to increase dues, the activities that are planned must become more self-sustaining which will mean that those who participate would see an increase in the cost of lunches, dinners and receptions. I heard various comments about the cost of the Dinner Cruise and from time to time the cost of our lunches and dinners at our meetings. Sarah McCurry does a great job in negotiating with the venues for room rates and the cost of all that we do. But the increases in prices are beyond her control and we have a very limited portion of our budget dedicated to District Meetings to defray some of the cost.

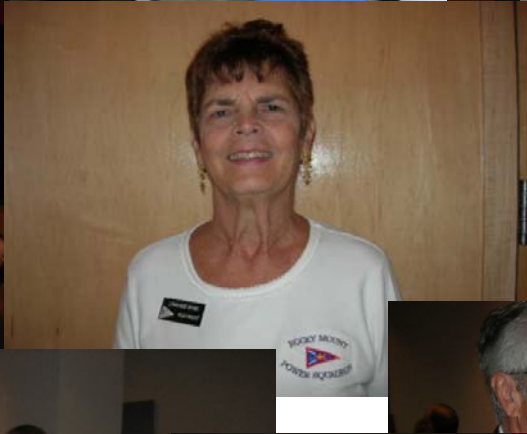
