## District Executive Officer—D/Lt/C Gene R. Alligood, AP

hat a fast year -- 2015 is over already?

Sharon and I attended the United States Power Squadrons National Governing Board in San Diego August 24 – 29. Following are excerpts from



the session I attended for District Executive Officers: There will be no consolidation of the National Meeting and the Governing Board in 2016. Consideration was given to consolidating the two meetings to reduce costs; however, the decision has been made to continue with two meetings for the foreseeable future. Members

carry the load for the meeting costs and Districts run the Organization/Structure. Registration fees for the National meetings subsidize the costs. Four hundred and nineteen members attended the Governing Board from 31 Districts (D/27n had 20 attendees); 75 members (or less) receive any reimbursement for expenses in any form. Historically, 350 to 400 members are paying full expenses "out of pocket" to attend the National Meetings. Many members make the National meetings a vacation trip.

Three-fourths of the United States Power Squadrons budget is derived from membership dues; onequarter comes from education sales and WEBINAR "Town Hall" meetings. Our "Branding" project is moving forward; but you don't have to burn your old shirts, etc. - you can still wear them. "Leadership Development" on the website has been updated to include "Role Modeling Behavior". Take a look at it. "Protocol" and "Procedures" seminars are coming up. The Vessel Safety Committee is requesting that Squadrons give accurate exam reports. squadron requested 400 decals last year, then requested 200 more; but, only reported 22 inspections. The squadron-proctored United States Coast Guard Captain's License Course has been reduced from \$595 to \$495 (interested squadrons should contact Shirley Heald at National Program Partner Relations).

A new survey shows our potential market on which to draw for membership is 45 to 60 years of age. Paddle Craft is a new market for USPS Membership. Seven hundred to eight hundred thousand units are sold annually – 70% in the United States. California has implemented mandatory "Boating Safety Education" – a Boating Operator License will be required in 2018. We have received \$504,000 in grants from the United States Coast Guard this year.

We have 18 Boating Operator Simulators available to Squadrons and Districts – 4 more are scheduled.

Sharon and I attended the District 27 Fall Conference in Charlotte October 9-11 where we visited with many of you. I always enjoy the District Meetings and renewing old acquaintances; but, making new ones has become frequent. I will be conducting COW activities in 2016 as follows: 01/16/2016 - New River; 01/29/2016 - Catawba; 01/30/2016 - Charlotte; 02/13/2016 - Fort Macon; 03/04/2016 - Raleigh. I will be in touch with Squadron Commanders prior to the scheduled dates to get your slate of Bridge Officers for 2016.

Sharon and I will be in Raleigh for the District Training on January 9<sup>th</sup>. I hope to see at least the Bridge Officers for all 20 D/27 Squadrons. I encourage all squadron members to attend; you don't have to be an officer to attend district meetings. We

will be judging the Boarman Youth Poster Contest entries in Raleigh; so come take a look at what the kids are submitting.

PFD reports are no longer required by the Coast Guard; so don't submit one. Chapman Award recommendations are due by June 30<sup>th</sup>.

The Annual Meeting is in Orlando at Rosen Centre February 17 – 21, 2016 and the D/27 Spring Conference and COW is at the Doubletree Hilton – Atlantic Beach 03/18-19, 2016.

**e-POSTCARDS REMINDER:** Again as a reminder to Squadron Treasurers, the IRS form 990 is due by the 5<sup>th</sup> month, 15<sup>th</sup> day after the close of

your fiscal year. USPS Headquarters wants to know that this report has been filed by submitting USPS form TR-1. Please contact me if you have problems with the forms or other questions concerning this very important task.

**NEW MEMBER ASSESSMENTS:** I have received to-date all payments for new members from all but one squadron for the first six months of this calendar year. New member assessments for July-December, 2015 will be sent to all squadron treasurers the end of January, 2016.

It will also help your members gain an understanding of their role within your squadron.

### District Education Report—D/1/Lt David H. Osmolski, SN-IN

A lot of water has passed under the keel since the last edition of The Bitts. Too, there have been many changes effected and proposed within the Educational Department programs.



The National Fall Governing Board was held in San Diego, CA 25 August through 30 August. Southern California is a nice place to visit, but personally I wouldn't want to live there. All along the coast there are high bluffs. Everything along these bluffs looks as if with the first good rain, it will fall into the Pacific. The

meeting venue was very nice with views of the Navy Base and the harbor with a lot of boating activity both civilian and military. It was too bad we didn't have windows in the Educational Department meeting room!

The Educational Department meeting lasted the better part of the day. There was a lot to be discussed, and as with almost every aspect of our organization much was concerned with decreases. The sales of all products were off by 7%. This included declines in sales of Basic Public Educational products, Practical On-the-Water training products, and Inland and Coastal Navigation products. Although this is discouraging, reductions in Cost of Goods Sold and Expenses resulted in Net

Margin after all expenses at \$261,142 is off only 1% from \$263,401 recorded in the prior year.

At last year's Annual Meeting, D/20 proposed a change in the grading of an Instructor Development candidate. The objection was there was too much emphasis on the lesson plan. It is now proposed that the candidate must receive a passing grade on presentation before the lesson plan is reviewed. Currently the grade is based 100% on the lesson plan. This will change to have 50% based on presentation and then 50% on the lesson plan.

Interactive On-Line courses are being developed along with the BoatUS Foundation. Hurricanes and Boats (what to do around your dock) seminar, All About Marine Radio (Using-VHF and DSC) and the first phase of Cruise Planning are now in production. Work is being done to produce a Using-GPS seminar and a How-to-use a Chart seminar

By 2016 there should be 18 Virtual Trainer units available for squadron use at boat shows and other boating related events. There will be a hiatus in production while our IT department checks software glitches and works out the bugs for smoother operation. Work is being done to partner with the NMMA to help provide funding to cover half the cost of shipping, electricity and expanded website coverage for virtual trainers at NMMA sanctioned shows.


